Overview

The *REU Site Intersection of Linguistics, Language and Culture Program* is recruiting talented undergraduate students residing in the NY area from (but not limited to) historically disadvantaged groups to partake in a part-time year-long program to engage in research on language(s) and benefit from workshops that will help you prepare for the next step in your educational journey.

Through funding from the National Science Foundation (NSF), 18 students will be selected to engage in a 29-week research experience in speech-language-communication-hearing sciences that will include:

1. Establishing a community of scholars through the attendance of a presentation on a topic related to your interest in speech-language-communication and participating to the site blog;
2. Conducting a research project with the help of a Research Mentor (see mentors' areas of specialization on page 2);
3. Research Ethics training required to conduct research that involves the participation of human subjects;
4. Presentation of your research at a student conference;
5. Participation in a workshops to prepare a graduate school application (that will cover topics such as how to prepare the GRE, select a graduate program, compile a successful application package);
6. The organization of a conference in the summer that will enable you to share your work with other NSF REU site participants and community partners publish a report on your project.
